
Morning Prayer

The Common Cup

Starting on Easter Day, it has been decided that we will reintroduce the use of the common cup at our communion services. This means that the current practice of the priest intincting the bread with the wine will stop and this will be replaced with the traditional method of offering both the bread and the wine separately.

For those who do not wish to receive the wine may just receive the bread and return to their seats. It remains Anglican teaching that to receive the sacrament in one kind only, is to receive the sacrament in its entirety.

The practice of the individual communicants intincting themselves is not permitted. For further guidance please see the following link from the Diocese of Europe.

Urgent request from the Ukraine Church in Leicester

Another full car of mixed items was taken to the Ukrainian Church last Friday. As usual, Bo and his helpers were extremely grateful for the items we had taken.

Since the appointment of Mr Trump there has been an increase in the urgency with which we support the Ukrainians particularly with food and medicinal items. The lack of support from the Americans has resulted in an increase in the raids by the Russians and the devastation being caused and the effect this is having on the lives of the Ukrainians. The peoples of the Ukraine are fighting for their lives so if you are able to support them please will you donate something from the following list of urgently required items. Food items along with medication – **not prescribed drugs** – toiletries especially for women and warm clothing. The following are the items that are required at the moment : -

Tinned meat and fish (ham, spam, corned beef, sardines, tuna, mackerel)

Soup – small tins if possible – Cup-a-Soups

Easy to make meals using boiling water as well as pasta, rice, etc. Warm clothing eg hats, gloves, sleeping bags.

Medical items (**not prescription drugs**) – plasters, pain killers, first aid kits – All types of toiletries including

toothpaste, soap, shampoo, sanitary wear etc.

It is right and proper we help those in our own community who are facing hardship and we can do that through the **Countesthorpe Community Trust Fund** and the **Food Bank** but please will you give some thought to helping those we will never meet whose plight is far far worse.




