
Morning Prayer

The Common Cup

Starting on Easter Day, it has been decided that we will reintroduce the use of the common cup at our communion services. This means that the current practice of the priest intincting the bread with the wine will stop and this will be replaced with the traditional method of offering both the bread and the wine separately.

For those who do not wish to receive the wine may just receive the bread and return to their seats. It remains Anglican teaching that to receive the sacrament in one kind only, is to receive the sacrament in its entirety.

The practice of the individual communicants intincting themselves is not permitted. For further guidance please see the following link from the Diocese of Europe.

Safeguard Training Saturday June 7th

As ever, it is important that all of us as church members play our part in protecting everyone from abuse of any kind and that we follow the Church of England guidelines.

Thank you to those of you who have completed your DBS (Disclosure and Barring Service) check and training.

The Diocese safeguarding training team have offered to come to St Andrews, on June 7th, to deliver basic and foundation level safeguarding training in the Bridge Building. Please could those of you who are outstanding in your training consider attending this. Please let Emma Adams, Dave McAughey, Helen Stokes or Jacqui McAughey know if you would like to attend as spaces are limited.

This is the outline of the day:

9.15am Refreshments available
9.30am Basic Awareness training (2.5 hours)
Mid-day Lunch – bring your own if you are staying
12.30 Foundation training and domestic abuse training (3.5 hours)

As a reminder

Basic Safeguarding training is essential for anyone volunteering in a Church. It is required for but is not limited to:

Vergers, servers, welcomers, caretakers, refreshment helpers, shop staff, sides persons, PCC members, church wardens, bell ringers, choir members, members of music groups,

Basic safeguarding training is a prerequisite for further training, including foundation safeguarding training and safeguarding leadership training.

This training is renewed every three years.

<u>Foundation training</u> is required for anyone who has safeguarding responsibilities or has contact within their Church role with Children, young people, and/or vulnerable adults.

This course is for lay volunteers and paid staff in roles involving contact with under 18's or vulnerable adults. It is also suitable for paid staff members who only have indirect contact with under 18's and/or vulnerable adults.

This course is required for but not limited to:

Anyone in a role which involves work with children, young people, or vulnerable adults, Churchwardens; Anyone going on to complete any other safeguarding learning pathway, Vergers, PCC Members/Lay Chapter Members.

Urgent request from the Ukraine Church in Leicester

Over the last 3 years when taking items to the Ukrainian Church in Leicester the atmosphere has always been upbeat. What a difference when taking another full car of mixed items recently, it was all deflation and sadness. We were advised by the team that with immediate effect they will no longer be accepting clothing etc. However they will continue to accept the following for the time being:-Tinned and dried food Medical items eg plasters, pain killers etc (not prescription drugs) Sanitary wear Please speak to either Karen or Geoff if you want to know more or are able to donate any of the above items.

Appeal for help with a Ukrainian family

We have been approached about the possibility of hosting another family.


Having had a few months without any lodgers, we feel we could help again but are rather daunted about all this involves. Sharing our home is only part of what they may need, so wondered if anyone else in our church family would be willing to join us in helping them settle in.

Their English is basic, so we predict they may need help with form filling e.g. registering at a new doctor and other things that come up. They are currently living in another area of Leicestershire, so will hopefully have universal credit sorted. Another need we predict is help with transport. Due to a medical condition they return to Ukraine 2-3 x a year for on gong treatment, so may need help getting to airports/train stations/coaches. They are a family of mum, daughter and auntie, with their men left behind to fight.

We only have basic details, and have not met them yet, as want to see if we can build a team before we make the final decision.

This is a very practical way of offering our support to Ukrainians displaced by the war, please consider and pray if you are drawn to





