


Morning Prayer

Advent Course

It promises to be a brilliant opportunity to stretch ourselves theologically, learn some new things, build our faith, and understand the Christmas story in a new way. Sue's teaching is very engaging and accessible, so come and enjoy! The two sessions will take place on the 3rd and 10th December in the Bridge, from 7.30-9pm.

Minster Communities

All four PCCs in the benefice decided to move forward into Stage 2 of the process, in which all willing churches in the area decide what their Minster may look like. In our area, eleven churches have agreed to work together so far. Cosby, Whetstone; Blaby; the Four Saints; Lutterworth, Cotesbach, and Bitterswell; and Husband's Bosworth are those churches. You may notice that this is a significantly smaller number than the area first included. The Avon Swift benefice of eleven churches have all voted red, meaning they have currently opted out of the Minster Community process. Narborough have not yet responded. This group of eleven churches proceeding with the Minster can still afford 3 stipendiary priests between them.

The steering group has met for the first time, formed of representatives from all the benefices involved in the Minster. Our representatives are Rev. Richard, and Richard Holdridge. The steering committee are now inviting PCC members to join four working groups centred around different ministries. Further details on these working groups are to follow.

As ever, we must look for God at work in this process, knowing He goes ahead of us. We give thanks for the friendships and beginnings of shared ministry with the ten other churches committed to the Minster.


Christmas Concert Raffle
